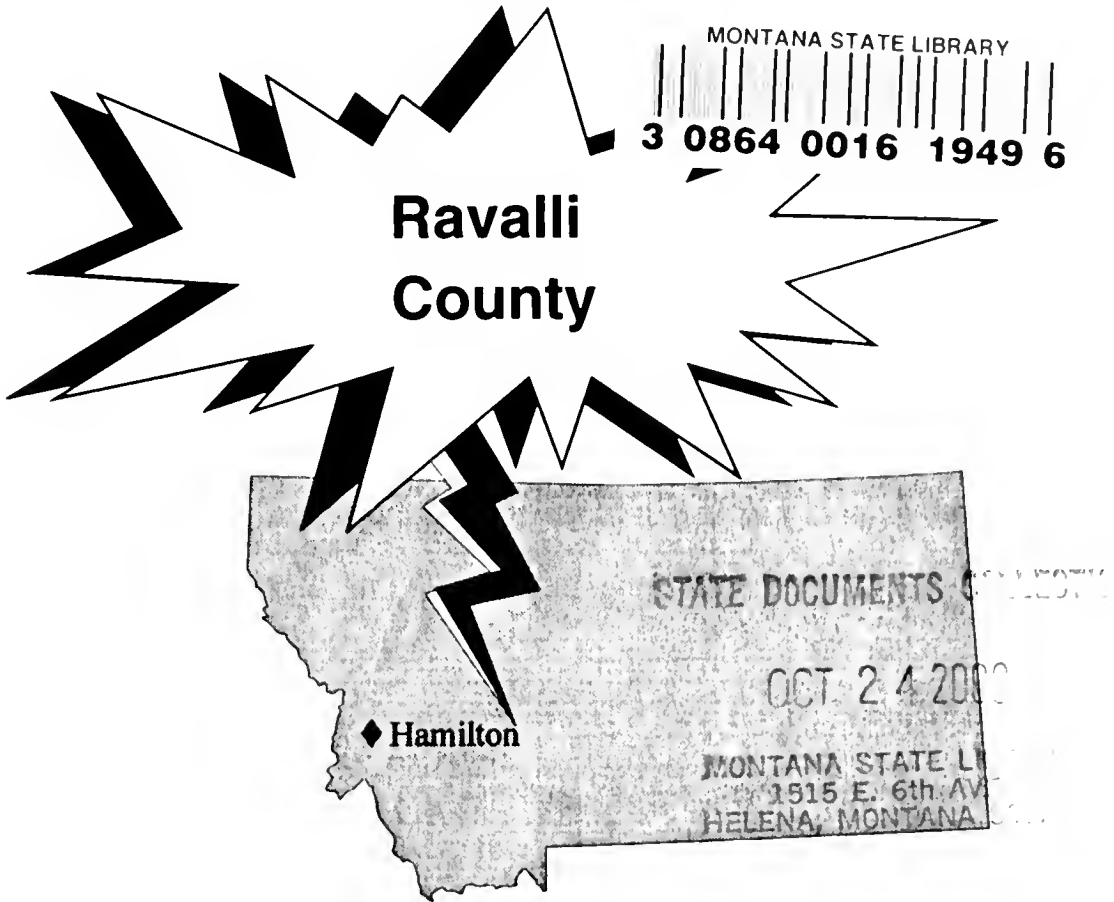

Ravalli County

Located in midwestern Montana, Ravalli County is Montana's eighth most populous with 25,010 residents, according to the 1990 Census.

Hamilton, the county seat, is the state's 28th largest city with a population of 2,737. According to the 1990 Census, more than 16 percent of workers living in Ravalli County commute to Missoula County to work. The county is home to the Bitterroot Valley, a passageway for the Lewis and Clark Expedition in 1805. It was also a former home to the Flathead Indians who invited missionaries to build St. Mary's Mission in 1841. Hamilton was settled around 1887 when Marcus Daly, a mining tycoon, established a lumber mill in the area.

According to the *Montana Almanac*, by authors Andrea Merrill and Judy Jacobson, the county was established in 1893 and named for Jesuit Missionary Father Anthony Ravalli who located to the region in 1845. Hamilton replaced Stevensville as the county seat in 1898, according to the authors, and most likely is named after early pioneer J. W. Hamilton.

According to the U.S. Bureau of the Census, median income for Ravalli County households in 1989 was \$21,113. The county is 2,400.4 square miles in area; 2,394.3 square miles in land area and 6.1 in inland water area.

County residents experience the four distinct seasons and the area is often referred to as the "Banana Belt" of Montana. According to the *Montana Almanac*, the average daily low in January between 1980 and 1989 was 16.3 degrees above zero and average January snowfall 12.5 inches. The average daily high in July was 84.1. The annual precipitation in 1995 was 18.53 inches and the length of the growing season 117 days.
